15:30 - 16:30	<p>Anonymous Credentials</p> <p>Abstract: Anonymous Credential (AC) systems enable transactions between users and organizations in a privacy-preserving yet authenticated and accountable manner. The organizations consist of Certification Authorities (CAs) that issue credentials to users after verification of the user's claim to the credential and Service Providers (SPs) who verify the authenticity of the credentials before providing access to the service. The users can show their credentials to SPs without revealing any information about themselves other than the revealed attributes in the credential.
